EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This is a written counterpart of D8.9, a Conference held in Brussels,

1. INTRODUCTION

There has been a ChatGPT influenced event organized by us at the European Parliament on May 25th, 2023. Below we describe the event as well as its contexts.

2. THE EVENT

The current project has made a strategic decision to take a leading role in the public debate on the generative AI and its impact, which is very closely connected to the project focus on human AI collaboration and Societal AI.

Because of this political decision, we have organized a one-day event @ European Parliament, presenting the new science of Artificial Intelligence that can put Europe on the world stage. The project HumanE-AI-Net, along with several partners and communities hosted a half-day event, titled "Beyond ChatGPT: How can Europe get in front of the pack on Generative AI Models?" at the European Parliament on May 25th, 2023.

This event aimed to foster discussions among AI experts, policymakers, and stakeholders to explore the potentials and risks associated with the rapid development of AI technologies, particularly large language models (LLMs) like ChatGPT, and how Europe can maintain a competitive edge in this sector.

Specifically, this event attempted to address the following questions:

- 1. What can and must be done to ensure European competitiveness in this area?
- 2. To which extent does Europe have the capacity to compete with US-based industries on LLMs and similarly impactful AI technologies?
- 3. How can we best harness the opportunities afforded by the latest AI technologies for the benefit of European economies and societies? What role does the proposed AI Act play in this context?
- 4. Which of the widely debated risks are real, and how should these be addressed? Is there a need for a moratorium or similar restrictions on research and innovation in key areas of AI?
